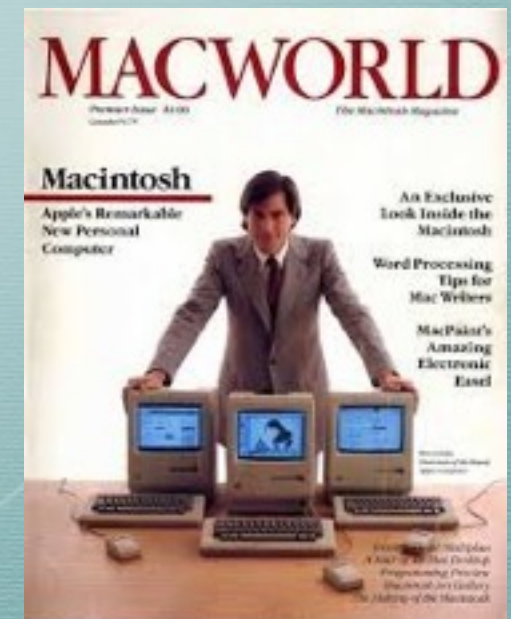

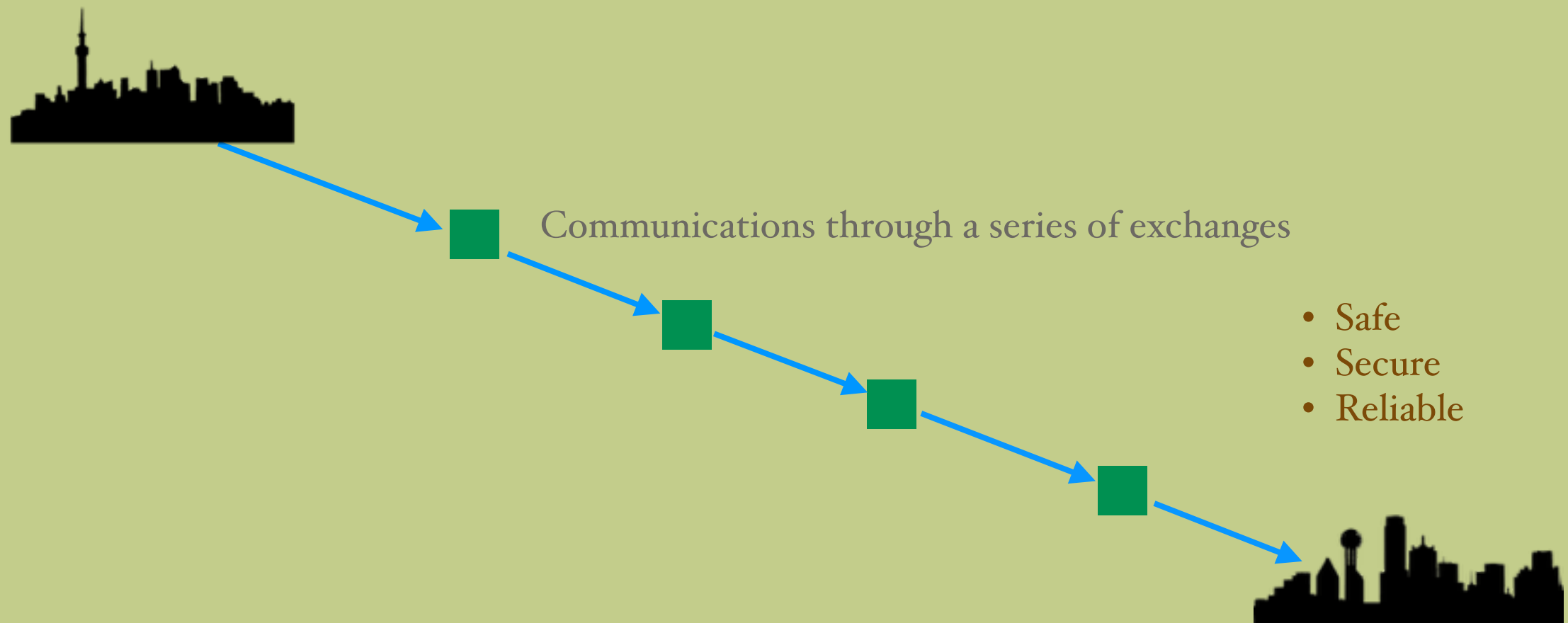

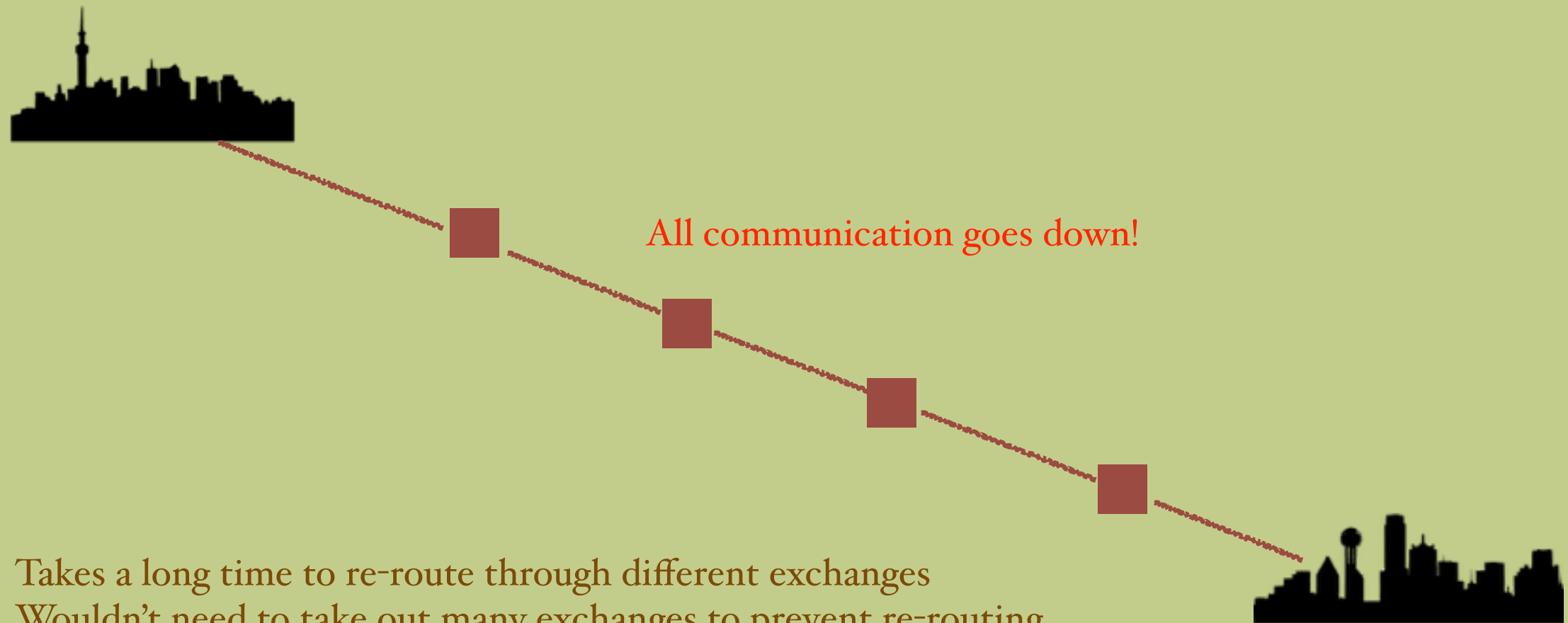


USA Military were concerned about attack!



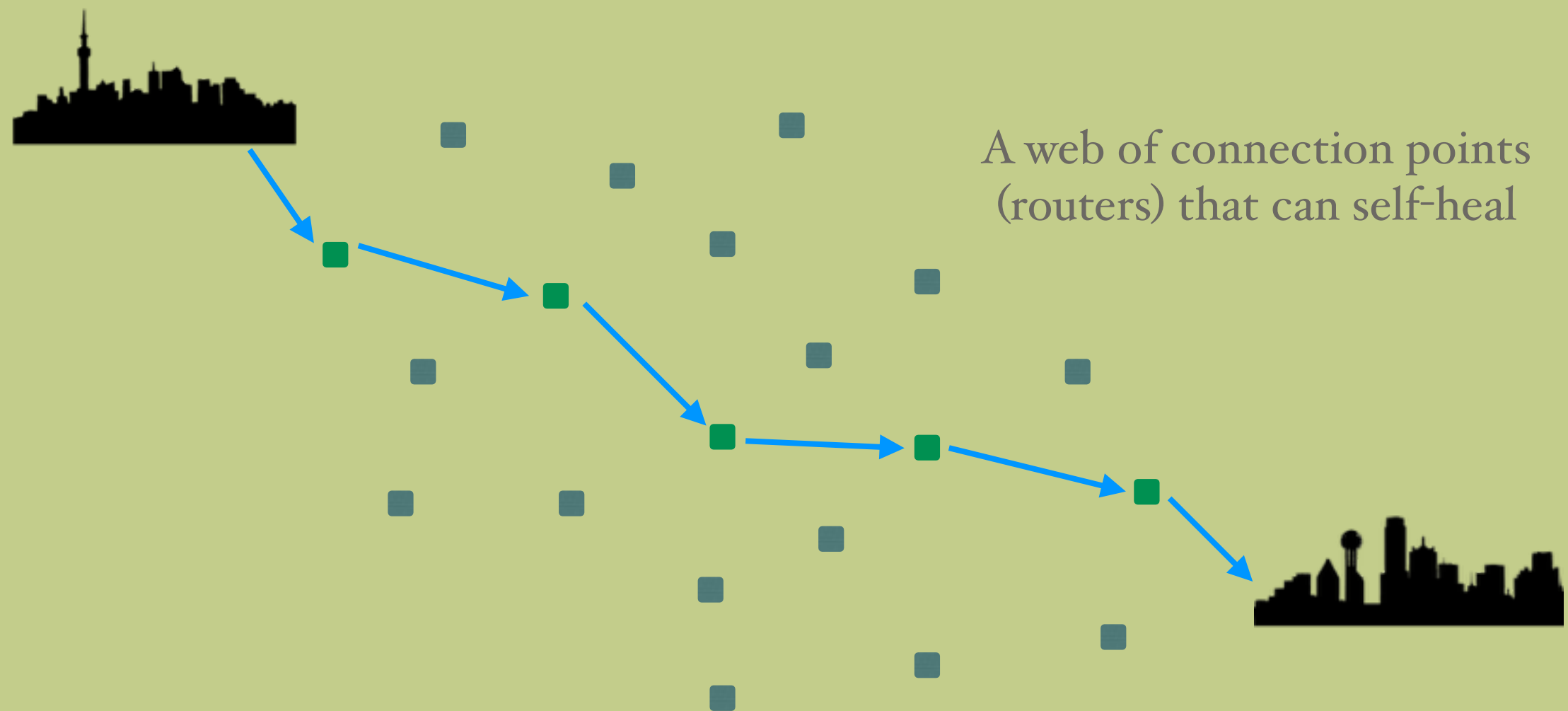
An attack takes out an Exchange

Before the Internet...

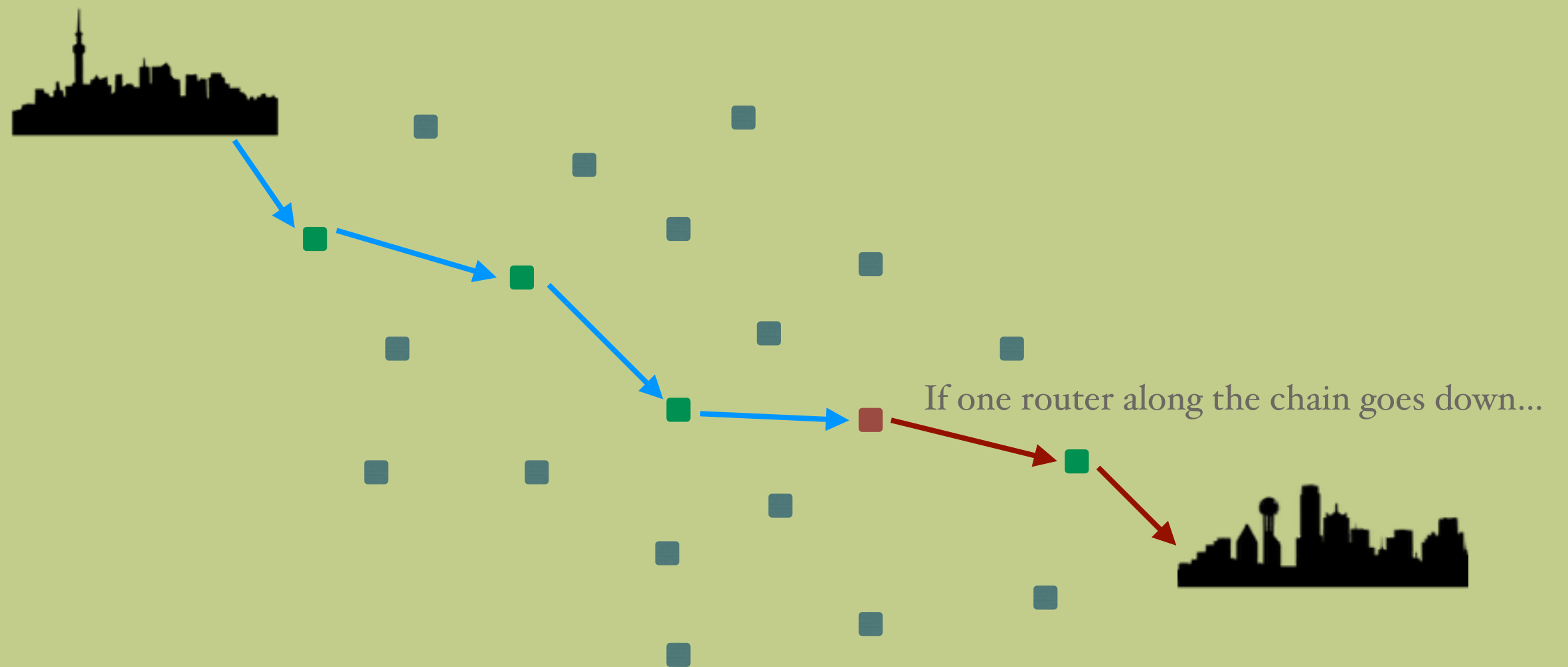


- Takes a long time to re-route through different exchanges
- Wouldn't need to take out many exchanges to prevent re-routing

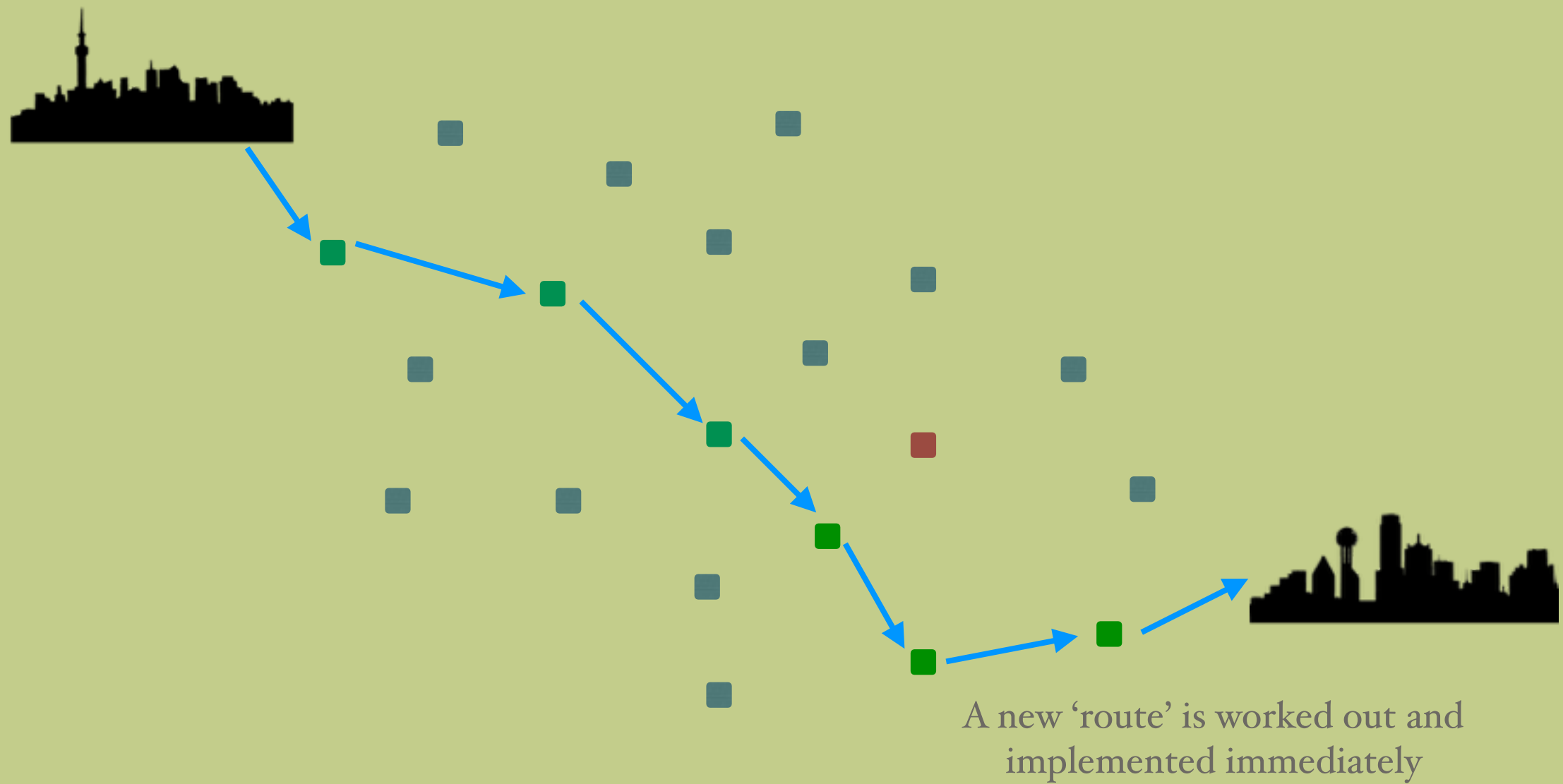

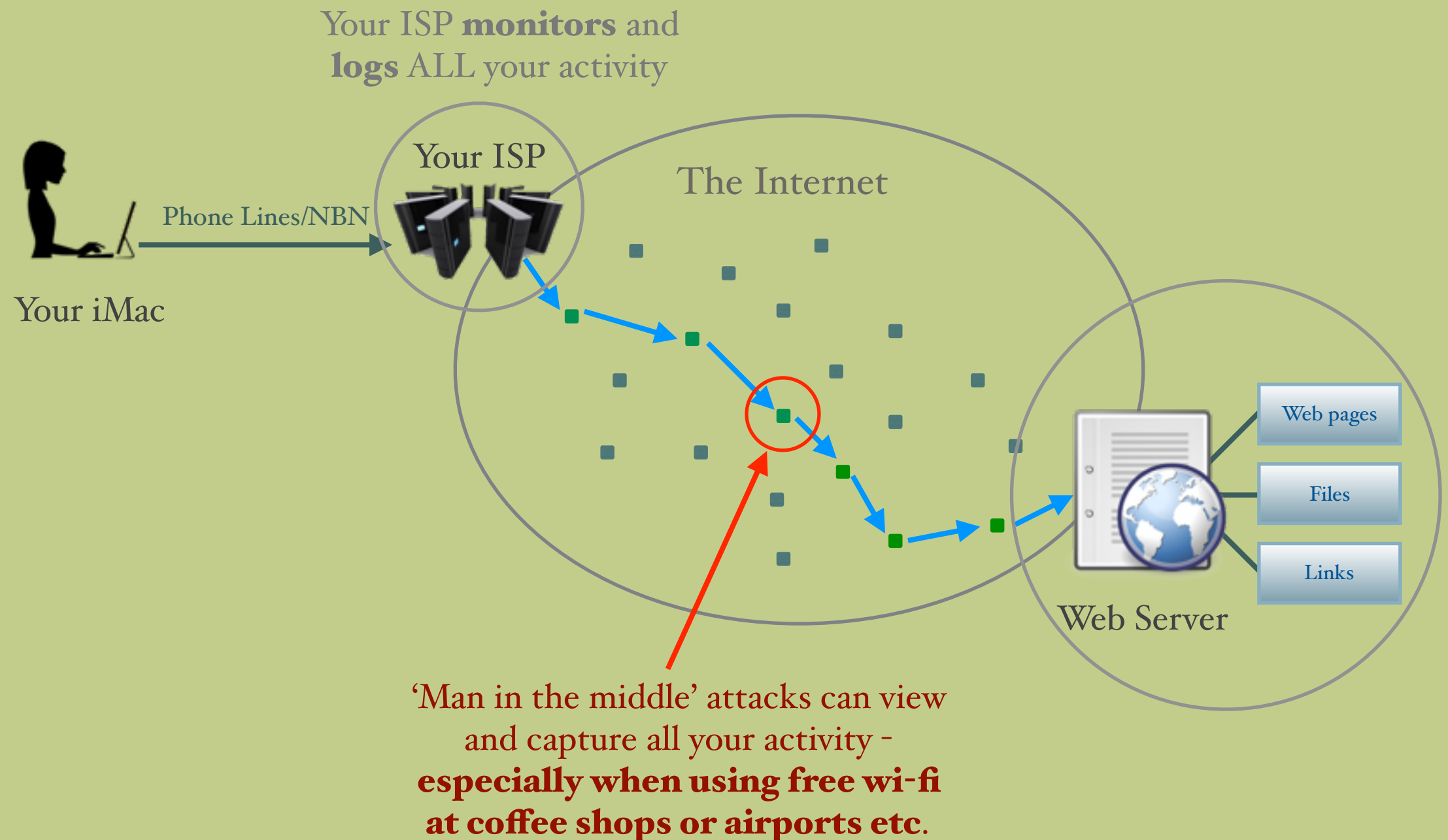


Your ISP...

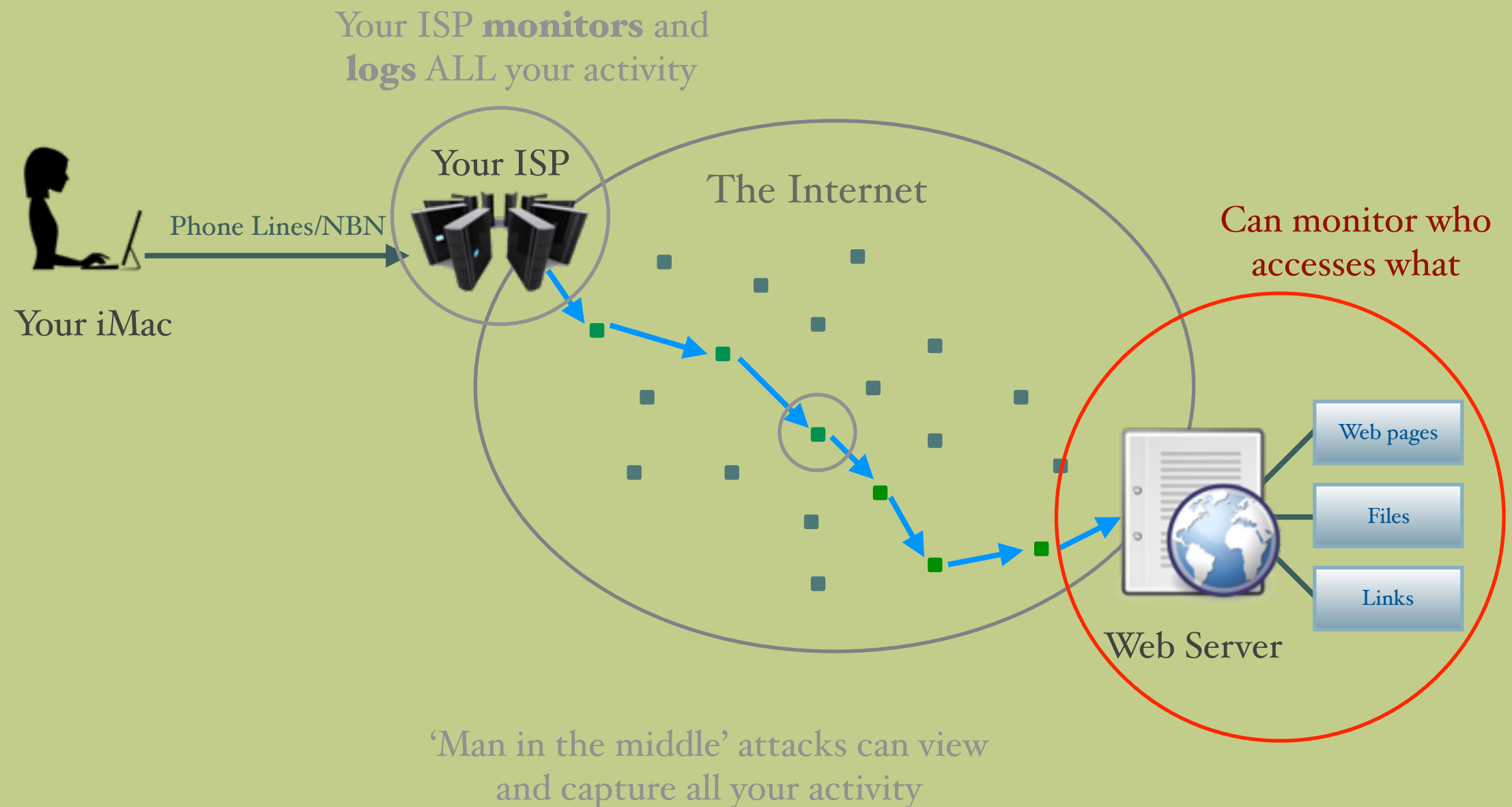


- You are identified by your IP address
- Every request you make is logged (date/time/location)
- Subject to data retention laws

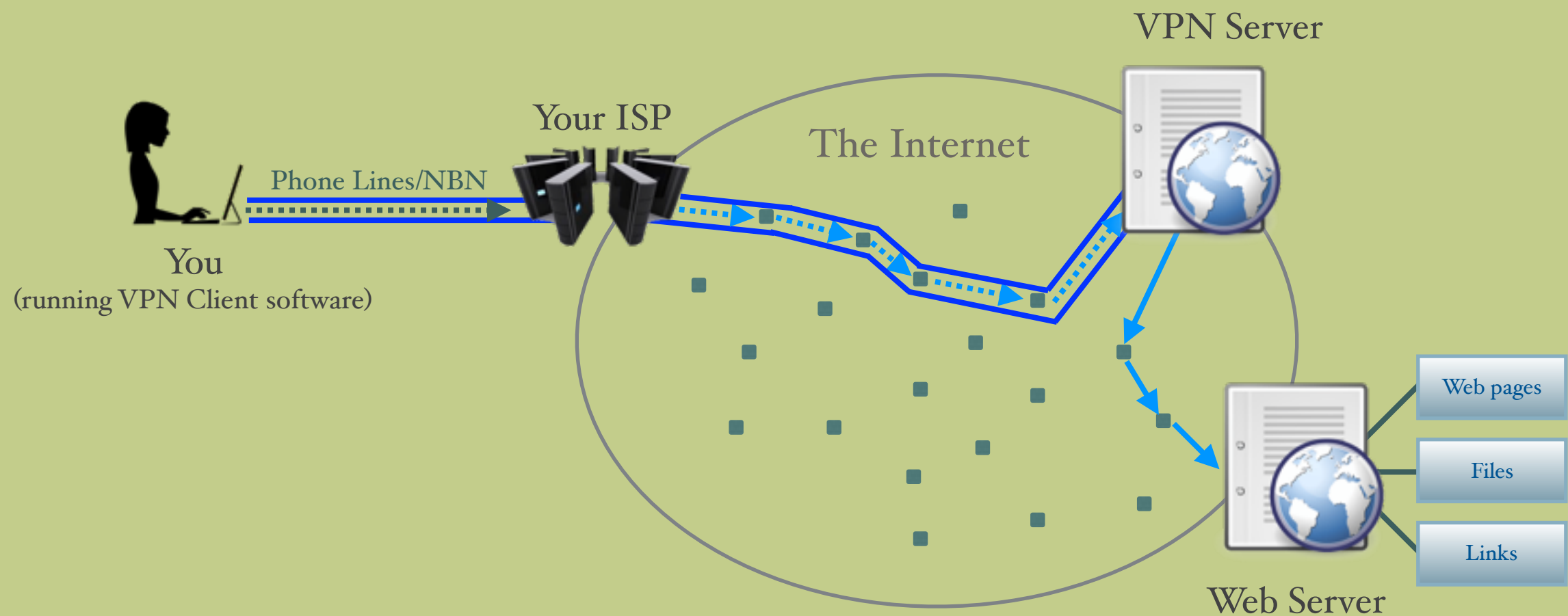
Prying eyes...



Site monitoring...



VPN is the solution...



- VPN connects you to a VPN server that does not keep logs - cannot track what you've requested;
- The VPN server requests web data on your behalf - no one can tell who request comes from;
- VPN creates a 'tunnel' that protects your data from prying eyes - your data packets are surrounded by another secure packet;
- VPN encrypts your data so even if someone can look into the tunnel, your data is gobbledygook;
- VPN tries to detect someone breaking into the tunnel and automatically re-routes the tunnel;

How Do You Use VPN?...

1. Go to your selected VPN provider's website
2. Register your details and choose a payment plan
3. Download the client software and install
4. Run VPN client software and enter your registration details
5. Choose to connect to a particular VPN server
6. Browse the Internet as normal - now *anonymously* and *securely*

Note: You can set up VPN on your router, PC or iOS device

VPN – the Good and the Bad...

Good	Bad
No one knows who you are when you browse	Can slow down Internet connection (5-20%)
Your data is encrypted and secure	Costs - around \$50-\$100 per year
You cannot be accused of doing things based on your IP address	
You can circumvent some geo-fencing restrictions

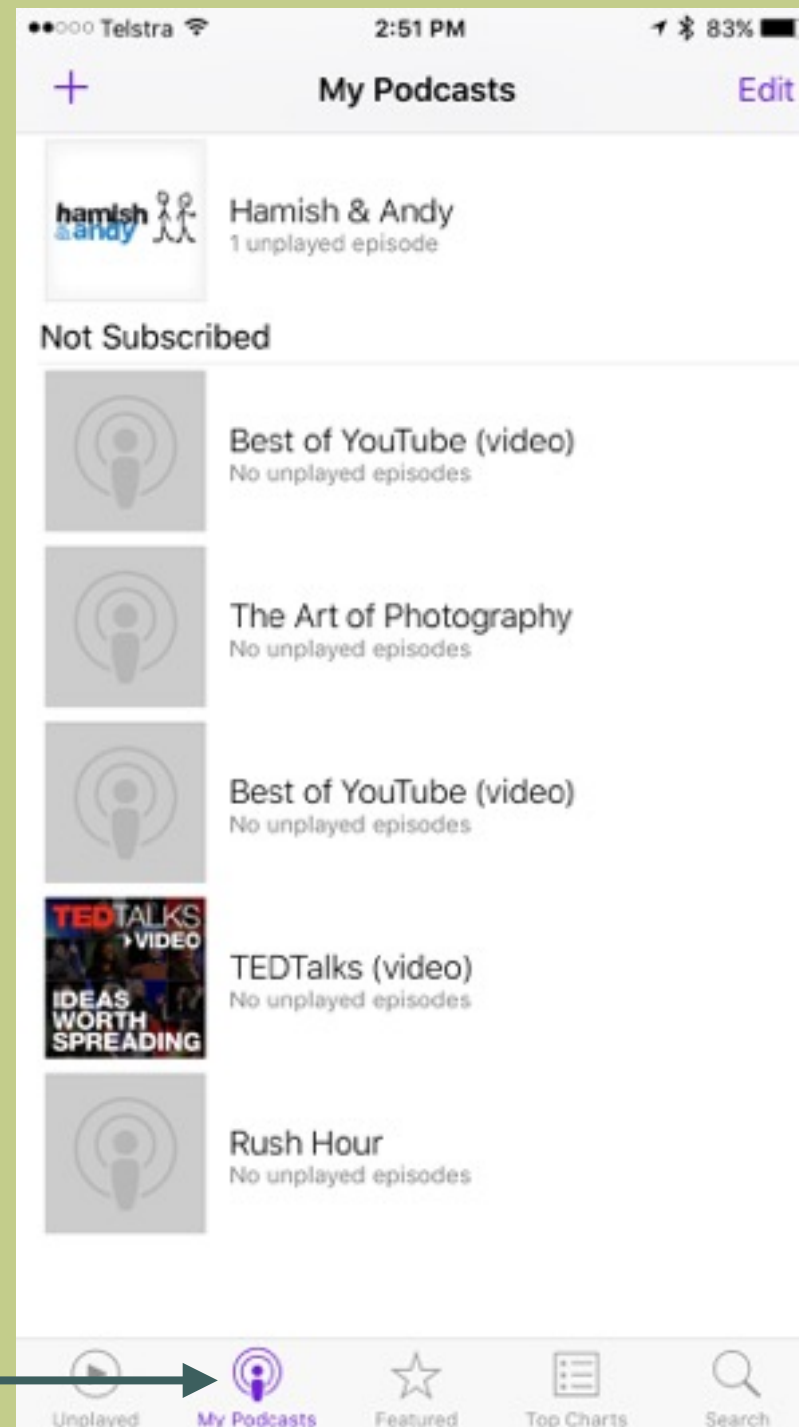

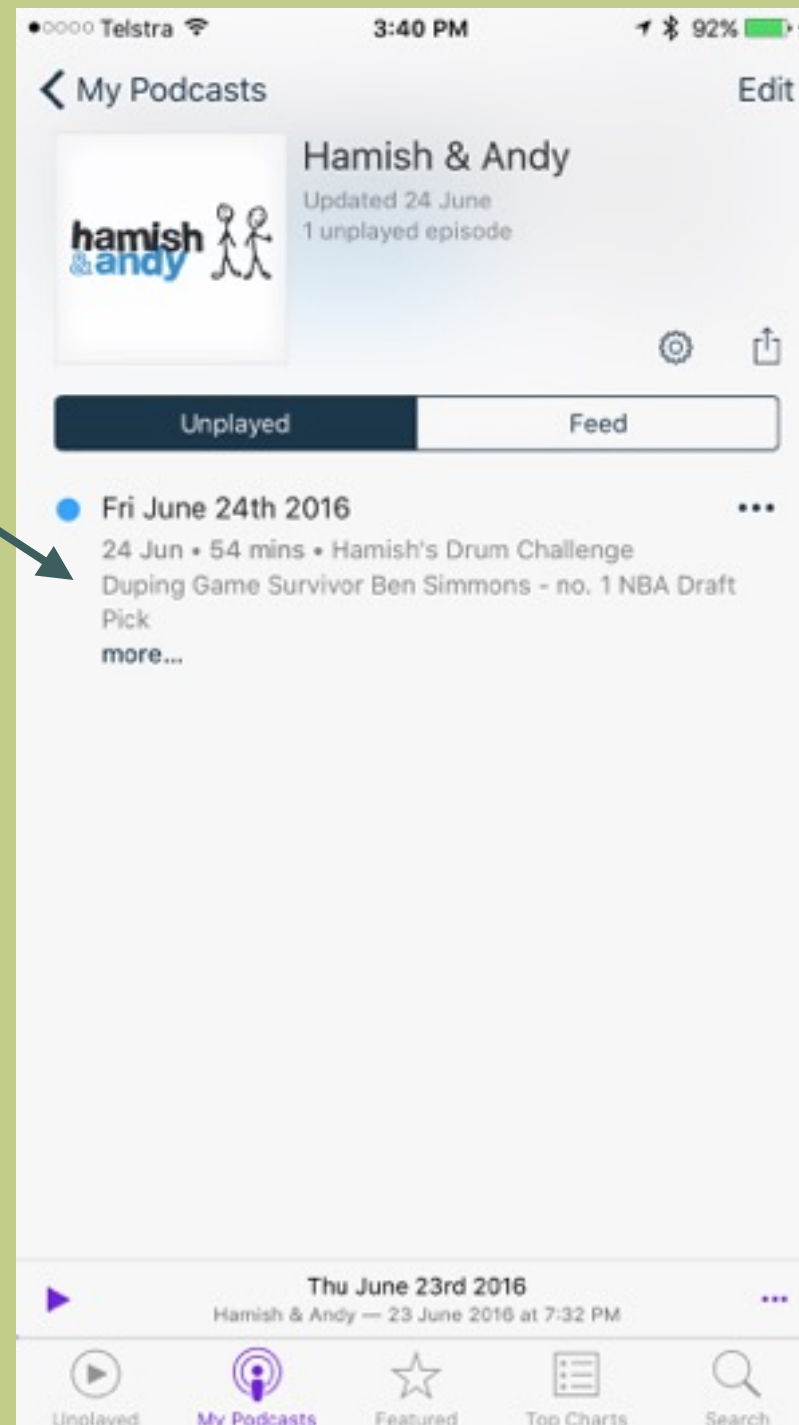



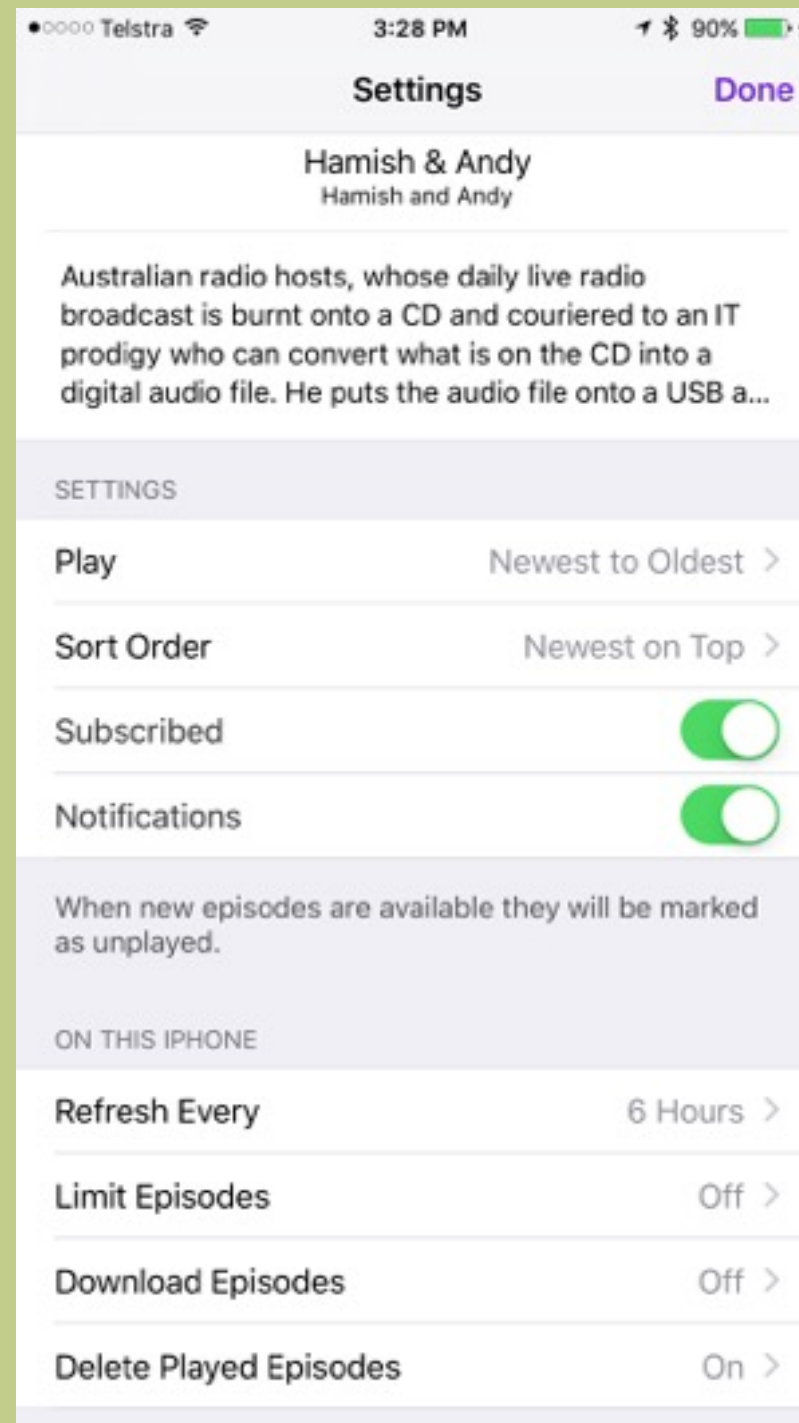

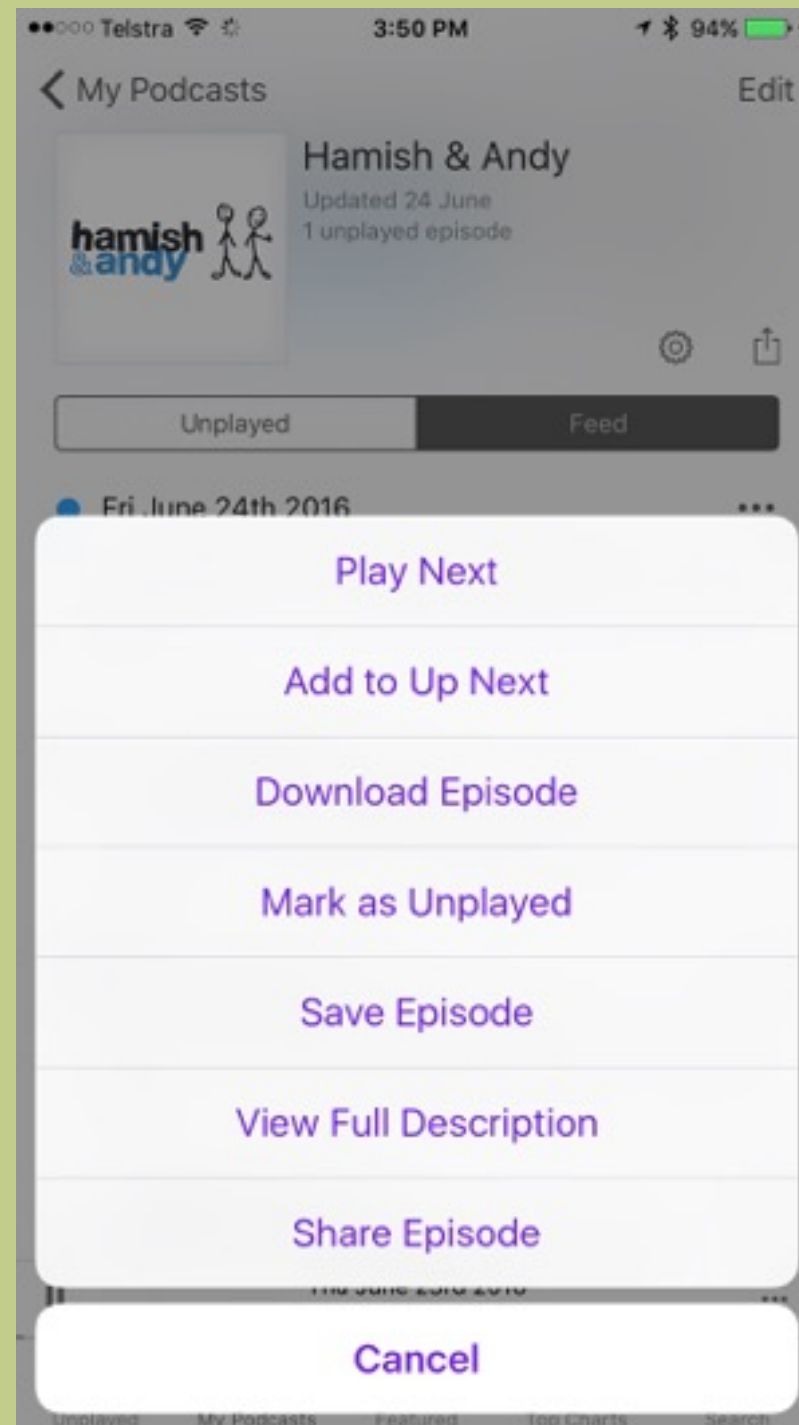

- App of the Month - **EMERGENCY** +
- Knowing how to call Triple Zero (000) in an emergency can be the difference between life and death.
- The Triple Zero (000) service is the quickest way to get the right emergency service to help you.
- It should be used to contact Police, Fire or Ambulance service in life threatening or emergency situations.
- Calls to Triple Zero (000) are free and can be made from mobile phones, home or work phones or pay phones.

- App of the Month - **EMERGENCY** +
- There are a few simple steps to take when making a Triple Zero (000) call:
 - Stay calm and call Triple Zero (000) from a safe location.
 - A Telstra operator will ask you if you need Police, Fire or Ambulance. Say the service that you require.
 - If you are calling using a mobile or satellite phone the operator will ask you for other location information.
 - You will then be connected to an emergency service operator, who will take details of the situation.
 - Stay on the line, speak clearly and answer the operator's questions.
 - Give the nominated emergency service operator the details of where you are, including street number, name, nearest cross street, and locality. In rural areas it is important to give the full address and distances from landmarks and roads, not just the name of the property.
 - Don't hang up until the operator has all the information they need.
 - If possible wait outside at a prearranged meeting point or in a prominent location for emergency services to arrive to assist them to locate the emergency.
 - If you make a Triple Zero (000) call whilst travelling on a Motorway or on a rural road, identifying the direction you are travelling and the last exit or town you passed through will assist emergency services to correctly locate the incident.

 - Additional tips: other things everyone should know in an emergency
 - If a person is unable to speak English, they should call Triple Zero (000) from a fixed line, say 'Police', 'Fire' or 'Ambulance'. Once connected to the nominated emergency service, stay on the line and a translator will be organised.
 - Record the Triple Zero (000) emergency number beside the telephone at home and work.
 - Take time to teach children and overseas visitors how to make an emergency call.
 - Callers with hearing or speech impairments can call the one zero six

Description
Helps people to call the right number at the right time. Using a mobile phone's GPS functionality so callers can provide emergency call-takers with their location information as determined by their smart phone. The app also includes SES and Police Assistance Line numbers as options, so non-emergency calls are made to the most appropriate number.

When calling Triple Zero (000), remember to stay focused, stay relevant, and stay on the line. Before you call, ask yourself:

- * Is someone seriously injured or in need of urgent medical help?
- * Is your life or property being threatened?
- * Have you just witnessed a serious accident or crime?


If you answered "Yes" to any of these questions, call Triple Zero (000). Triple Zero calls are free.
